This packet of information prepared by the March N Spartan Band boosters is designed to help you understand how the Instrumental

Music Program at Villa Park High School works, what to expect, what are the responsibilities of the parents, and details about the 2017-2018 school schedule as it relates to band activities.

The Instrumental Music department is led by Music Director Charles Jay, a California credentialed teacher of Orange Unified School District and a United States Marine Corp Major. Students and parents respectfully call him "Major." The program includes many subgroups, some of which have additional instructors that come from either the state-funded ROP (regional occupational program) or the private sector:

Marching Band

Color Guard (it may have been called "tall flags" back in your day)

Multiple Jazz ensembles (Combo, Jazz 1, Jazz 2, Jazz 3 and combinations of these groups depending on the performance)

Orchestra (strings)

Symphonic Band

Drum & Bugle Corp

Riflemen (military-style US flag color guard)

**Baton Twirlers** 

Winter Guard (additional, special wintertime competition for Color Guard)

The Instrumental Music Department is part of the Academy of Performing Arts at Villa Park High School that also includes: Choir, Madrigals, Drama & Dance. The Instrumental Music department regularly provides live music accompaniment for events put on by these other group/departments.

With this many performing groups, you can imagine the performance schedule is QUITE FULL as you will see on the attached <u>CALENDAR</u>. Students may perform in any group with the Music Director's prior approval. Knowing what group(s) your student is in throughout the year will help A TON. Also, with this many performing groups and performances, it becomes easier to understand the ABSOLUTE NECESSITY of parent support – both financially and as helping hands throughout the year. <u>The district does not provide funds for buses, uniforms, shoes, and most equipment.</u> The boosters raise funds for them. Please refer to the page "How can I help?" in this packet for more details.

Most music students arrive at high school with at least some background or experience in music. Classroom and afterschool rehearsal time is spent preparing for performances so basic instruction in how to play an instrument is very limited. If your student needs additional basic instruction in how to play an instrument, please consider private lessons that are available through many sources in our community. The number one reason students quit the band is frustration over not being able to play their instrument confidently. Private lessons can help with this.

As a public high school, instruments are provided to the students. Due to limited funds, there is no guarantee as to what instrument your child will receive, although every effort is made to honor his/her preferences. The Music Director reserves the right to have students share instruments due to limited inventory. Renting instruments from a local music store and/or purchasing your own are options that are open to you. Please consult with the Music Director for additional information/suggestions.

The marching band is organized through a leadership structure starting with the Director of Music and any additional staff, followed by a student Drum Major and two student Lieutenant Drum Majors. Each section then has a designated student leader(s). Color guard has two Co-Captains and two Co-Lieutenants this year. Your student will get to know his/her section leader and come to rely on him/her for schedule information, problem solving and peer-assisted instruction. If possible, it is extremely helpful that your student have access to modern electronic communications – text messaging, Facebook, e-mail, etc. – to keep up to date with the fast-paced and ever-changing program schedule.

Band members and their parents can also ask to be added to:

#### Performances are KEY to the program

In the classroom, it is easy to understand that there is a test on Friday and taking the test is an integral part of the learning experience and evaluation of what has been learned. On a sports team, it's easy to understand that all players are needed on the field during a game. In performing arts, showing up and participating in the performances is the equivalent of a test and the game. All performances are mandatory unless prior

arrangements have been made with the Music Director. Mark the dates on the calendar and **DON'T MISS**. Please refer to the attached **CALENDAR** for the known performance dates.

#### **Information about Uniforms**

Uniforms are issued on a loan-only basis to students by the Band Director. Students are responsible for maintaining their uniforms and returning them clean and in good condition. Parents will be charged replacement costs for lost or damaged uniforms, including lost bow-ties, cummerbunds or citation cords. Here are some basic uniforms that cover most of the activities for the band (Color Guard uniforms and equipment are separate; information covered in a separate packet):

- 1. Marching Uniform (replacement cost \$650): Shako with plume (hat & feather), Jacket with citation cords, Bibber pants with suspenders, special marching shoes known as Dinkles (each student must pay for their own Dinkle shoes please refer to the last page of this packet).
- 2. Black tunic with blue sash, and black bibber pants with suspenders, black Dinkles. (Replacement Cost: \$150)
- 3. Tux and Gown (Replacement Cost \$85-\$250) used for orchestra, symphonic band, super band and other performances Boys wear school-issued tuxedos, girls wear school-issued black gowns students are responsible for providing their own appropriate black dress shoes. No tennis shoes or sneakers will be allowed with formal wear.

This introductory Parent Survival Guide is hopefully a good source of information to get you acquainted with the Villa Park Instrumental Music Department. More information will be coming from the Music Director throughout the school year. You are also invited to attend the monthly band booster meeting where the Music Director and parents work together for the benefit of the students. Stay close and stay tuned! Please read on to learn more about the Weekly schedule, this school year's calendar (so far) and how you can help your student and the program be successful.

# "How can I help?"

The Instrumental Music Program needs every parent's support in two very important ways:

- 1. Financial

#### **FINANCIAL**

The Instrumental Music program at Villa Park High School far exceeds your basic public high school band program. With more than 160 members, a dozen or so performing groups, and around 100 performances a year, it's easy to understand that it costs a bit of money to keep it all going. The school district is generous, but there is still a financial gap to fill.

Each member of the Instrumental Music program is asked to participate in the "My Fair Share" program, which is **a \$350 donation** to help cover costs. This tax-deductible donation can be paid all at once during Band Camp or installment payments throughout the year via check or credit card online. Please refer to the **ORDER FORM** on the last page of this packet.

The money collected helps covers the costs of: Transportation, instrument acquisition and repair, sheet music, uniforms, props, food costs for long performance days, website upkeep, enhancements to the Performing Arts Center and rehearsal rooms and much, much more.

#### **Helping Hands**

The March N Spartans is the all-volunteer parent booster club for the band and color guard that contributes to the program in two main ways:

- 1. <u>Hands-on</u>: Helping to organize/move equipment, provide chaperones at events, advertising and marketing of the performances, maintenance and upkeep on the website, taking video of parades/performances, taking photos, bookkeeping, communications, administer water along the hot parade routes, put plumes in the shakos, provide hospitality at concerts, decorate tables for the banquet, set-up outdoor patio lighting for the Senior Concert, drive the Thunder Wagon or tow the Spartan Alliance trailer the list goes on and on and lots of people with a variety of skills are needed to keep things moving.
- 2. **Fundraising**: Active planning and execution of fundraising activities throughout the year that include:
  - The Firework Booth
  - The Annual Car and Bike Show
  - Dinner Out Fundraisers
